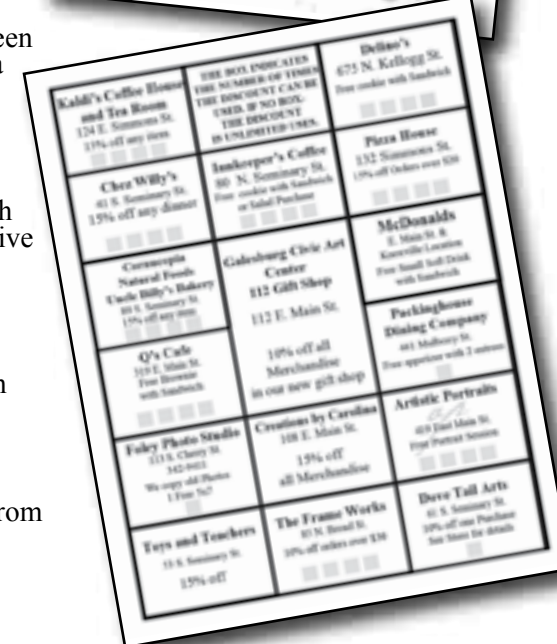
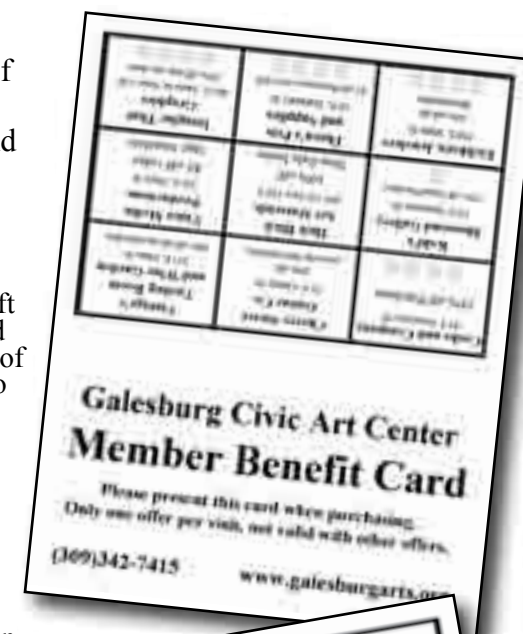
Feeling a little creative yourself?

A Letter from the President – Bill Morris

Aristotle wrote, “The aim of art is to represent not the outward appearance of things, but their inward significance.”

I started my first letter as president with the Galesburg Art Center Board with this quote from Aristotle. As my presidency winds down in it’s second year, it still seems fitting.

While president, the economy took a tumble; the fiscal health of the State of Illinois became anemic; and the Art Center found itself looking at new ways to make ends meet and balance the budget. Our staff continues to work for us greatly because of arts jobs preservation support from the Illinois Arts Council made possible by the National Endowment for the Arts through funds allocated from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

Outwardly, the Art Center has pushed forward, business as usual, with a façade renovation. We rolled up our sleeves and started work on an expanded gallery and a new gift shop, One12. We added events like Great Bowls of Soup and Wickedly Live. We added a membership benefits card with discounts all over the community as well as at One12. We continued our array of services and gallery exhibitions in the face of declining sponsorships.

Our expansion moves forward with construction on a kitchen and handicapped accessible bathroom as well as a new HVAC system. In order to complete these improvements, we will need continued support from benefactors and members throughout our community.

When we are finished, and the construction dust settles, we will be a flexible facility capable of handling receptions of up to 100 people.

On the inside, we are a thriving organization with about 240 individual and business memberships, an active board of fifteen dedicated volunteers, and a tireless staff. We are curators of a thriving arts community that remains creative and progressive. We have pushed forward everyday redefining our mission to educate, enhance, and enrich.

The “inward significance” of The Galesburg Civic Art Center adds to the foundation of our community. Our events have an aesthetic and economic impact on the local economy that cannot be denied. We strive to inspire and challenge the senses of all the people with whom we connect.

In June, my presidency will be over. Another volunteer will step forward and take the challenge of making a significant contribution to our community. As I look back I am encouraged that the future of Galesburg and our Art Center will be bright and prosperous.

My deep felt thanks go out to all the volunteers, artists, members, and benefactors that have contributed to our success. I have enjoyed serving as president, and will continue to serve on the board in the future. Stay tuned for the many wonderful things the Galesburg Civic Art Center has planned.

Massachusetts- Amherst. Michelle was born in Jacksonville, Florida and received her BFA from the University of Florida in 2008. Although her background comes out of painting and drawing, in the last couple of years she has been exploring more sculptural and installation methods.

Her work is autobiographical and deals with concepts of personal memory and temporality. Working in a site-responsive manner, she attempts to create installations that have a specific relationship with the physical scale of the viewer’s body and relevant speculation about the real world. Michelle desires to achieve a reconnection to the interior self through triggered memory.

AREA ARTIST WEB LISTING

We are working on the area artist information on our web site and we would like to include you! If you are currently a member and would like to have your information listed please take the time to follow the directions below. If you do not have e-mail you may mail the information to us on a CD and we will pass it along to our webmaster. If you are not a member and would like to become one please contact the Art Center office.

Submit 3-8 images as .jpg files.

Resolution of 72 pixels per inch, 600 to 800 pixels in the large dimension..

The images should be named in the following manner:

Your last name followed by an underscore followed by the name of the piece. All lower case with underscores instead of spaces between words and, finally, the .jpg extension. The names should be no longer than 25 characters, so you may have to leave out some words.

Example: blackwell_red_orange_earth_lg.jpg If you could include the _lg at the end of the string (as I have in the example), that would be a big help. (The lg simply signifies that this file will be the large example.)

The main goal is for Rob to be able to:

1) Properly identify the piece and 2) Copy and paste the name into his software. Rob will create the small thumbnail size from the large ones, so all you have to send is a single file sized to the dimensions specified in the first paragraph.

Image Text – Please send the text for each image in the following manner:

Name of piece (underlined if possible); Medium (oil on canvas, etc.); Date of creation (just the year); Size of piece, length and width (in the order of your choosing) and depth (if applicable); Status of the piece – (ie: in collection, available, NFS, etc.)

For an example of how this looks, see this image of Lori Reed's: Area artists - Lori Reed on galesburgarts.org.

Click on the fourth image down, the one with the spirals floating out of the arch. Notice that the sections of the information are separated by a space, a dash and another space. Adhering to this convention will make Rob's job much easier.

This data can simply be sent as copy in your email message and Rob can then copy and paste. (You can also send or drop by a disc with your images and attach the requested information to the Art Center.) Please place the title of each piece on a separate line with double spacing between lines. Due to the large amount of data Rob will be dealing with, your cooperation on these requests will be very helpful and much appreciated.

If you prefer, you can mail or drop off a disc of images (with the requested information attached) to the Art Center at 114 E. Main St., Galesburg, IL 61401. Rob will process the material he receives on a “first come, first served” basis, and post it promptly.
